LRA NEWS

Local Plan. The local *Guardian* newspaper has carried an article about our local MP on its website and in yesterday's paper headed "Eleanor Laing backs house building on Jessel Green". You can see the article and comments on it here. The LRA has responded:



"The District Council first raised the idea of building on Jessel Green in 2008. Since then they have consistently ignored widespread objections from residents

and Councillors. The proposal conflicts with the rest of the Local Plans provisions on green spaces. Because it has completely ignored the responses to its consultations, we consider that the Council has failed to follow a proper democratic process.

We call on our MP to restate unambiguously her objection expressed 10 years ago to protect Urban Open Spaces."

Highways issues

- **High Road traffic lights,** junction with The Drive, Brooklyn Avenue and Brooklyn Parade. LRA Cllr Chris Pond has asked the Local Highways Panel for a feasibility study on the re-phasing of the lights to improve traffic flow.
- **Opposite Homebase:** a resident reported that the lamp column at the corner of Rectory Lane and Church Hill, with a Belisha Beacon attached, has not been working for 12 months or more. This is a dangerous situation with pedestrians occasionally having near misses with left-turning traffic.

Chris has reported this more than once (the response last time was that it was an electrical supply issue) and will follow it up again.

- Alderton Hill drain. Essex Highways report that, as promised last November, the gullies for notorious drain near the Brook Road junction have been jetted and are now clear and running.

 Unfortunately, when they've done this in the past the drain has flooded again as soon as there's heavy rain, because the problem is not at the roadside but at the far end of the gully where it flows into the brook. If you find the drain is blocked again, please let us know (a photo would be excellent) and yet again we'll take it up with Highways.
- Cuthbert's alley (next to the Wimpy Bar, High Road). After it was re-opened, the Wimpy extract duct has been venting into the alleyway making it an unpleasant place to be, and there's been no street-lighting. When LRA Cllr Judy Jennings visited this site; a builder there told her that the duct was only temporarily fixed above the alleyway and was due to be positioned within the restaurant running through the building and exiting at the rear. She is following up the lack of street-lighting.
- Parking in Forest Road. A resident complained that during the day Forest Road is often fully parked, and residents are unable to find spaces, because shoppers are parking there for ½-an-hour or an hour, taking the chance that they will not get caught for a ticket. LRA Cllr Chris Pond confirmed that he had already asked NEPP to vary and increase their Civil Enforcement Officer visit times.

Trade in The Broadway. A District Council's proposed rent increase has come as a final blow to several traders in The Broadway, They are suffering the effect of long months of roadworks, and now increasing competition from shops in the new retail park (to which the District Council has given significant rent-free periods). Unlike the High Road, The Broadway consists mainly of independent traders, many with a long history in the town. LRA Cllr Chris Pond has raised



with Conservative Portfolio-holder Cllr Grigg, as a matter of urgency, the way in which the retail park is undermining the whole economic basis of The Broadway.

Loughton Festival

The programme for this year's end-April & May events is available <u>here</u>. At the Festival stall at our April 8th Farmers Market in the High Road (outside Robert Dyas), Festival volunteers will be waiting to give you a programme and tell you more about the Festival events.



The Festival will be raising funds for the <u>Chigwell Riding Trust</u>, which was the first riding centre in the world for people with special needs and has been established in Chigwell for over fifty years. Riding instruction is given to people of all ages and abilities. The riding centre has approximately 160 riders each week.

More defibrillators

- These are on their way to the High Road and The Broadway, thanks to the LRA-led Loughton Town Council, with support from our two Town Centre Partnerships (traders & residents), who have got funding from the District Council, and with donations from the Rotary Club of Loughton, Buckhurst Hill & Chigwell and the Debden Traders Association.
- **a portable defibrillator** has been generously donated by the local Park Run group for use at events on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground.
- Training. Defibrillators are easy to use (spoken instructions from the machine) but the Town Council will be organising free training sessions on the use of CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) for any interested residents.

Part-night street lighting.

An Essex Police report finds no evidence that part-night lighting has an impact on crime levels.





<u>Queen Elizabeth's Hunting Lodge</u> will be closed until March 26th. <u>The View</u>, next door, will be open as usual, 10am - 5pm, Monday – Friday.

Highways issues

- Speed table, Pyrles Lane, Chester Road, Hillyfields. Residents have asked the Local Highways Panel to have the speed table removed, because of the noise level when traffic passes over it. However, County Design Engineers and Road Safety feel that the safety measure is still needed, so the existing speed table will be replaced with new material to current road specifications.
- **Torrington Drive.** A resident had reported highway defects to the County Council and also asked the local (Conservative) County Cllr to take a look. He did so, but commented that most of the individual road issues have already been identified by Highways as 'not requiring works' at this stage however, the resident's point is that the whole road surface needs urgent attention.



Using the same password means that if a hacker gets hold of the password for one of your accounts, they've got easy entry to the others!
