#### **Local Road Repairs**

Pavement repairs have been underway this week in The Drive, Marjorams Avenue and the High Road. This is part of the County Council's Members' Highways Initiative (MHI) that has enabled LRA Cllr Chris Pond to highlight these specific repairs.

The MHI is funded by £8 million of the £12 million announced for highways repairs in February across the County. The funding has been allocated across different areas of work, including additional highway crews for each borough, city and district to prioritise repairs raised by local ClIrs and residents.

The County Council have not provided any update for Loughton Library, but they have announced plans for Colchester Library where they plan to close the library for one year for refurbishment, with nearby libraries opening for longer hours to compensate. News article

This might be a comparable situation to Loughton Library, so Debden and Buckhurst Hill libraries might open a couple of extra hours a week during the construction work.

Clearing Overgrown Alleyway Vegetation
After being contacted by a resident LRA Cllr Rose
Brookes arranged for lots of vegetation in the Kirby
Close alleyway to be cut back and trimmed.



# **Planning and Licensing**

#### 230 High Road (previously Boots)

This application proposes demolishing the existing single story extension to the rear of the existing ground floor shop, and replacing it with a new extension on the same area.

The premises are planned to be used by a veterinary practice. Although the change of use does not need planning permission, the District Council can impose conditions on the new addition to the rear where dogs are going to be kept overnight. LRAPG has asked for the extension to be soundproofed to protect the amenity of adjoining neighbours.

Reference <u>EPF/1381/24</u>. The formal consultation period ended 7 August but you can still comment to the Council.



# **Corner Garth, corner of Nursery Road** and **Highview Close**

There have been succession of planning applications to extend this dwelling including new boundary treatment. LRAPG has raised concerns with Essex Highways regarding the hoarding which has been haphazardly put over the pavement and does not look secure. Pedestrians are also pushed onto the road to avoid the structure. Hoardings placed on the highway need a licence and LRAPG

has asked whether this was ever awarded a licence and for it to be checked for safety.

#### Premises Licence Appeal - The Gardeners Arms, York Hill

Notwithstanding a licence review in April 2022 where members of the Licensing committee tightened up the restrictions on the use of the pub's outdoor seating area (later relaxed by licensing officers), LRAPG has started to receive complaints about noise and antisocial behaviour. It is disappointing the premises is causing problems again, which started after the numbers of tables and chairs were increased along the forecourt. Under the circumstances LRAPG has asked for a new review of the licence and its conditions to ensure residents are not disturbed.

### Roads, Parking and Travel

#### **Planned Road Closures**

- Valley Hill the road will be closed between 7pm and 6am until 17 August between Greenstead Road and Roding Road for road surface patching by Essex Highways. More
- Church Hill due to gas mains replacement works, the temporary traffic lights are planned to remain in place until 20 September. More
- The Uplands the road will be closed until 23 August for gas mains replacement by Cadent. More



- Pump Hill the road will be closed until 30 August for gas mains replacement by Cadent. <u>More</u>
- Church Lane the road will be closed until 24 September for gas mains replacement by Cadent. <u>More</u>
- Oakwood Hill the road will be closed between 7pm and 5am from 3 to 11 September for road repairs by Essex Highways. More

Dates can change so <u>check here for the latest updates</u>, and for other planned roadworks including ones that involve only temporary traffic lights.

#### Parking Charges for Station Road

Parking charges now apply on Station Road Monday to Saturday between 9:30am to 5pm. Disabled Blue Badge holders can park in the paid-for bays free and without time limit but may *not* stop on the red lines.

Remember that NEPP wardens now work on Bank Holidays. Unless the sign says that charges don't apply, they do

In June in our district, the County Council repaired 411 potholes and 66 pavements, cleared 2239 drains and fixed 187 streetlights.

#### **Violence and Vulnerability Unit (VVU) Community Grants**

The <u>Violence and Vulnerability Unit (VVU) Partnership</u>, funded by the Home Office, Essex Police and the County Council, are now accepting applications for the VVU Community Grant. Groups can apply for up to £20,000 to deliver support and interventions for children, young people, young adults and families (families must include children, young people or young adults aged 0-24 inclusive). Projects must demonstrate how they have a positive impact through protective factors on issues relating to serious violence.



#### One House, Four Blue Plaques

A new blue plaque has been unveiled at 19 York Hill in recognition of Mexicanist Diana Kennedy (née Southwood). She was born at 19 York Hill in 1923 and was known as the authority on all things Mexican especially cuisine. She received numerous awards for her work, including the Order of the Aztec Eagle from the Mexican government, and received an OBE. More from the Town Council (PDF).

There are now four blue plaques on the building with the others being for Arthur Bacot (Medical Entomologist), Christopher Cutchey (Loughton's first photographer) and Edward Cummings (Clerk of the Works at St Paul's Cathedral), the latter two which of were paid for by the home owners as the Town Council did not have

sufficient funds.

LRA Cllr Chris Pond, speaking at the unveiling commented "We think four blue plaques on a house is a bit of a record and I believe Joanne and Mike Burns (the owners) are going to contact the Guinness Book of Records to see if it is. We know there are 19 houses in the country with two blue plaques."

#### Taking Care in the Hot Weather

In hot weather, take care and look out for vulnerable family, friends and neighbours. <u>More advice here</u>

Also swimming in lakes and reservoirs can be dangerous even if they look inviting in

hot weather. This includes lakes in the Forest and Roding Valley Lake. The Fire Service has advice about <u>using barbecues safely</u>, <u>caravan and camping safety</u> and <u>bonfires</u>. Ensure coals or wood or anything used in a fire pit or barbecue are completely cool before you move or dispose of them.

And please don't smoke in the Forest or on the Roding Valley Recreation Ground.

There have been recent social media posts that suggest that Loughton Health Centre is closing. This is *not* the case. There are no plans to close and they remain open as usual for their patients.

#### **Leisure Centre Boiler Replacement**

LRA Cllr Rose Brookes represents LRA on Loughton Leisure Centre's Partnership Board and reports that £300,000 has been awarded from the Sport England Swimming Pool Support Fund to replace the Leisure Centre's boilers, which are now over twenty years old. The District Council had to bid for the money from the Fund, which also provided funding for 325 pools across the country. More



The new eco-friendly boiler system will reduce energy consumption and carbon output.

Places Leisure again offered free swimming during the summer holidays this year for children on free school meals, with letters were sent to all local primary schools to distribute to the relevant parents.

In Epping, work on the new Leisure Centre is on track and it is expected to open in late Autumn 2025.

#### **Summer Activities in the Forest**

The latest <u>Forest Focus</u> has lots of good ideas for days out in the Forest, from short strolls and children's activities, to food and refreshments at Forest huts and High Beach Church. <u>More</u>

#### **Epping Forest Big Walk**

This annual organised walk returns on 15 September and is now one of the biggest annual events celebrating Epping Forest and its heritage. Whether you are a first-timer or a returning walker, join 200 people from all walks of life to walk through the wonderful Epping Forest, get to know this rare surviving piece of ancient woodland, and celebrate its irreplaceable biodiversity, culture and heritage.

Guided by volunteer walk leaders, the walk is 14 miles from Manor Park in Newham to Bell Common in Epping, with talks about the Forest along the way, as well as three refreshment breaks. You don't need to be an experienced hiker to join the walk, although you will need to be reasonably fit.

Booking required. <u>More</u> including the timetable. Please only register if you are genuinely committed to take part as the walk is generally oversubscribed and has a maximum number of people that are able to be led on the walk.

#### **Woodbury Hill Habitat Restoration**

If you have visited Woodbury Hill and admired the view across the Forest, you will have noticed that the ancient grassland there has an issue with scrub and sapling encroachment. Like so many of the Forest's grasslands and heathlands, the extent of Woodbury Hollow is much diminished. If left, this ancient grassland and the scarce species it supports would disappear.



Habitat restoration work will start on 19 August with removal of young trees and scrub to return the grassland closer to its historic size. This will improve the resilience of the wildlife populations it supports and encourage plants such as heather, devil's-bit scabious and cow-wheat. This is one of the first locations for the 2024 Habitat Restoration Programme visits.

To improve access to Woodbury Hollow a thin section of Staples Hill wood pasture will be restored by removing holly, invasive cherry laurel and young trees. The increase in light levels reaching the nearby veteran trees will help prolong their life. New pollards will also be created ready to become veterans of the future. This will allow the grassland maintenance team and the Forest's cows to visit more regularly, further improving the condition of this special grassland.
