New District Local Plan

The new Inspector, Jonathan Bore, has now released his proposed changes to the draft Local Plan.

The full details are here. LRA is considering these. The Inspector has <u>said</u> any new and amended main modifications, once agreed with the District Council, will need to be published for public consultation.

The Broadway – maintenance and repairs at last

The District Council has announced that it intends to embark on a series of external maintenance and repair works at The Broadway shops and flats (11A-77A & 12A-82A) within the next 12-18 months. The high-level intention at this stage is that the works will include roof replacements, window replacements, walkway and balcony

upgrades, anti-social behaviour upgrades and compliance works amongst others.

LRA comment: despite pressure from LRA Cllrs, the Council has neglected this area in the past. We know it needs doing, as The Broadway has getting shabbier by the year, however it should have been done bit-by-bit over 20+ years. However we understand these repair works do not address work to public spaces (except for wall treatments), the central planting island, or provide an annual budget for maintenance.

Questions remain such as "why do window replacements yet again?" and "how are residents who own their own flats going to afford it?" (as some flats have been bought by tenants under the Right-To-Buy-legislation, and they will need to contribute to the cost. LRA will be watching closely the terms offered to owners by the Council).

The non-lit High Road Lights

We've <u>reported previously</u> that over half the streetlamps in the busiest part of the High Road are not working.

The latest update is that the County Highways Portfolio Holder, Cllr Lee Scott, has said they will be changed as part of an 'LED phase 4 project'. This means that they won't be fixed until they can be replaced by LEDs; LRA Cllr Chris Pond understands that the Council cannot get LED adaptors for the current luminaires (the entire light fixture including the lamps), which implies the entire luminaire will need replacing.

Road Closures

Residents will have noticed road works by Thames Water at Valley Hill (again) and Alderton Hill in the past two weeks, which have caused disruption locally.

Thames Water also planned to start work at the corner of the High Road and The Drive earlier this week, which would have compounded the disruption. However LRA Cllr Chris Pond raised this with County Highways Portfolio Holder Cllr Lee Scott, and the work was deferred

Could you help examine LRA's financial accounts once a year?

Planning and Licensing

Changes to the Council's Planning System

The District Council has made changes to its computer system which has resulted in a delay in consulting neighbours and LRAPG over new planning applications. LRAPG has therefore received very few applications over the last month but expect the Council to catch up with the backlog shortly.

Gardeners Arms pub, York Hill - Appeals and Variations

There has been much controversy over the running of the pub; anti-social behaviour and noise issues have been well documented.

The District Council Licensing Committee undertook a detailed review of the pub's licence in a hearing that lasted a day; LRAPG attended and made representations, The Committee laid down various revised conditions for how the pub should operate in future. The Gardeners Arms have appealed against these revised conditions. No details of the grounds of appeal have been made public to date. We also believe the appeal was submitted out of time because it was sent to the wrong court.

The Gardeners Arms has also applied to the Council for a "minor variation" of the licence to allow 70 people on the front terrace. LRAPG was surprised and disappointed that the Council's licensing officers decided not to consult publicly over this change. We consider that this is not a minor variation and should not be treated as such. This is more than double the number of people the Committee decided

should be allowed on the terrace. It's a significant change which could severely impact on the amenity of the residents close-by, due to the likelihood of additional noise, disturbance and anti-social behaviour. In our opinion, the Gardeners Arms should respect the decision of the Licensing Committee.

LRAPG is very disappointed with the Council's lack of communication in respect of the appeal and the variation application and will be asking for changes in the law to ensure effected residents and local amenity groups are compulsorily consulted on licensing applications. Notwithstanding what the law currently states, it is good practice for the Council to keep stakeholders informed, particularly on serious matters such as this one.

Roads, Parking and Travel

Planned Road Closures

- Alderton Hill the road is closed for works by Thames Water. The notice is in for 21 days from June 23rd, however work is estimated to be completed by July 4th. More
- Etheridge Road the road will be closed July 4th to 8th for joint sealing. More
- Alderton Hall Lane the road will be closed on July 17th between 9:30am to 3:30pm for pole replacement works by Openreach. More
- Clays Lane the road will be closed from July 25th to August 1st for work by Cadent. More
- Debden Lane the road will be closed from July 25th to August 24th for work by Cadent. More
- Englands Lane the road will be closed from July 25th to August 26th for work by Cadent. More
- Lower Road the road will be closed from July 25th to August 8th for works by Thames Water. <u>More</u>
- Borders Lane the road will be closed from Homecroft Gardens to 50m eastwards from July 30th to August 7th for new connection works by Thames Water. More

Dates can change so <u>check here for the latest updates</u>, and for other planned roadworks.

New Parking Restrictions

We have been notified that the schemes for Brooklyn Avenue/Priory Road/The Drive, Alderton Hall Lane/The Lindens and St Nicholas Place/Borders Lane will be going ahead in the next few weeks and restrictions will be in force from July 8th. The restrictions are mainly no stopping at any time on specific road corners.





The scheme for Baldwins Hill will be delayed as they have to consider late objections.

Bus Route 418

Notice has been given to the Traffic Commissioners by the current operator, Stephensons, of the withdrawal of bus route 418 that serves Loughton, Abridge, Theydon Bois and Epping from July 31st. However, they have also given notice for about 20 routes across the county, which may indicate this is part of some kind of negotiation with The County Council more generally. LRA Cllr Chris Pond is following up to find out more.



Upgrades to M25 at Junction 28

National Highways plans to upgrade junction 28 of the M25 at Brentwood to ease queues and congestion at this heavily used junction. Preparation works will begin at the end of July with the main construction work starting in October. Completion is planned for summer 2025. More.

Speed Checks

In response to concerns over speed, Essex Police carried out speed checks on June 26th across the Southend and Epping Forest District areas resulting in 123 drivers reported for speeds of up to 62pmh in a 30mph and over 100 on the M11

LRA comment: the cost of the lights comes out of the Council's council tax budget, and so there's always a difficult balance to be struck between the brilliance (or otherwise) of the displays and their cost – we look forward to seeing the new lights this Christmas.

A failed experiment

In 2012 the County Council entered into a PFI contract for the design, construction, financing, commissioning, operation and maintenance of a mechanical and biological waste treatment plant in Basildon ("Tovi eco-park") to process the County's and Southend's residual waste - the "Facility". (All other separately collected waste - recycling, green waste and food waste - would continue to be processed elsewhere.) The contractor chosen was a special purpose vehicle ultimately owned by a Spanish waste management company and English local construction specialist Balfour Beatty Group Limited.

Cutting a very long story short, the Facility, once built, did recover an additional 10% recycling from the residual waste stream, but did not entirely meet the Council's requirements in accordance with the contract. Also, the market for refuse-derived fuel (a substance like lignite) fell apart after the Dutch government banned imports for the large EFW plants at Amsterdam. It has taken significant court actions and lengthy negotiations with the financial organisations which funded the PFI contract to get to the current point, where (at no further expense to council taxpayers) the building will be demolished and the land handed over to the Council. It's a sorry story, but one which the Council seems to have managed well, and indeed as well as could be expected. More (item 6).

Population changes in Epping Forest

The Office for National Statistics has released results from the 2021 Census. Some key results:

- In Epping Forest, the population size has increased by 8.3%, from around 124,700 in 2011 to 135,000 in 2021. This is higher than the overall increase for England (6.6%), where the population grew by nearly 3.5 million to 56,489,800.
- As of 2021, Epping Forest is the 20th least densely populated of the East of England's 45 local authority areas, with around three people living on each football pitch-sized area of land.

- There has been an increase of 16.6% in people aged 65 years and over, an increase of 5.7% in people aged 15 to 64 years, and an increase of 9.6% in children aged under 15 years.

Queen Victoria's oak

Much care is given to the Forest's many thousands of ancient trees which includes recording and monitoring the condition of them. During a routine tree inspection of the red oak at Queen's Green, High Beach, a structural weakness was identified in one of the main branches.



A long-term management plan is being prepared to ensure this special tree can continue to thrive for many more decades. In the short term a temporary fence has been erected underneath and visitors should not go through the fence or sit under the tree branches to reduce ground compaction and the risk of the weakened branch injuring people.

Warlies Park

The undulating pastoral parkland to the north of Upshire was acquired by the City of London Corporation in 1986 and now forms part of the Buffer Land of Epping Forest. The park is criss-crossed with public footpaths, a public bridleway, permissive horse rides and permissive free-range on-foot walking areas. It is a place to visit either for a picnic, a quick walk or a whole day's exploration.
